



## TRIPURA BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION

The policy for tabulation of marks for H.S. (+2 Stage), Madhyamik & Allied Examinations, 2021 of TBSE has been approved by the Government of Tripura Vide NO.F. 29(1)/LETT/EAM/TBSE/2018, dated 01-07-2021.

### **POLICY FOR TABULATION OF MARKS FOR MADHYAMIK AND H.S. (+2 STAGE) EXAMINATIONS (INCLUDING MADRASA ALIM & MADRASA FAZIL), 2021.**

#### **Madhyamik**

1. The pre-board exam of Class X has been held in 3 (three) subjects, viz. Language I (Bengali, Kokborok Mizo & Hindi), Science and social Science, and has not been held in 2 (two) subjects, viz. English & Mathematics. So, the students who have appeared in the pre-board exam may be awarded the marks which they have obtained in the performing subjects. The highest marks obtained among the three performing subjects may be awarded in the two non-performing subjects.

Illustration: Suppose a student has obtained 60 marks in Language I, 70 marks in Science and 65 marks in Social Science. In this case he/she will be awarded 70 marks in both English and Mathematics.

2. There may be some regular students who have not appeared in the pre-board exam; at times not even in a single subject. In this case, such students will be awarded the final marks which they have obtained in the written exam portion of the respective subjects in the annual exam of Class IX.
3. If a candidate has not appeared in one or more subjects of the Pre-board examination, conducted by the Department of Secondary Education, the marks obtained by him/her in Class IX in the said subject(s) will be considered; and thereafter, the highest marks among the three subjects in which pre-board exam has been taken will be awarded in other two non performing subjects.
4. The Madhyamik Examination for Continuing, Compartment, External & External Compartmental category candidates along with candidates who are dissatisfied with the marks received through formula will be conducted by the Board within the time frame of 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2021 to 20<sup>th</sup> September, 2021. The detailed examination schedule will be notified in due course, subject to the condition that the COVID situation becomes conducive for holding such examinations. \*\*
5. In case of 6<sup>th</sup> subject of Madhyamik the theory marks out of 30 will be calculated proportionately from the marks obtained in the practical portion.

### H.S. (+2 Stage)

1. Assessment of theory portion of all subjects of H.S. (+2 Stage) will be done as per following procedure.

(a) 30% marks will be taken from the **theory portion** of the highest scoring subject in Madhyamik, 30% marks will be taken from the **theory portion** of that particular subject in Class XI and 40% marks of the **theory portion** of the subject will be calculated on the basis of the performance in Internal Assessment/ Practical Exam of class XII.

- (b) 40 % marks for theory portion of a non practical subject will be calculated as follows:

Suppose a candidate has obtained 15 marks out of 20 marks in Internal Assessment, then the marks in theory portion of that subject as per weightage will be –

$$\frac{15 \times 32}{20} = 24$$

- (c) 40 % marks for theory portion of a practical based subject (**except Music**) of Class XII standard will be calculated as follows:

Suppose a candidate has obtained 27 marks out of 30 marks in practical exam, then the marks in theory portion of that subject as per weightage will be –

$$\frac{27 \times 28}{30} = 25.2$$

- (d) 40 % marks for theory portion of Music subject will be calculated as follows:

Suppose a candidate has obtained 44 marks out of 55 marks in practical exam, then the marks in theory portion of that subject as per weightage will be –

$$\frac{44 \times 18}{55} = 14.4$$

2. The H.S. (+2 Stage) Examination for Continuing, Compartment, External & External Compartmental category candidates along with candidates who are dissatisfied with the marks received through application of formula will be conducted by the Board within the time frame of 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2021 to 20<sup>th</sup> September, 2021. The detailed examination schedule will be notified in due course, subject to the condition that the COVID situation becomes conducive for holding such examinations. \*\*

## **Internal Assessment & Practical Exams**

### **For Class X**

(i) The Pre-Board examinations of Class X in Mathematics and English subject have not been taken. It has been decided that the internal assessment marks of the said subjects will be computed as follows:

**5 marks from weekly tests and 5 marks from assignment, the total will be multiplied by 2.**

The other three subjects in which pre-board exam have been taken the internal assessment will be computed as follows:

**5 marks from weekly tests, 5 marks from assignment and 10 marks from pre-board.**

For practical based subjects (6<sup>th</sup> subject) of Madhyamik in which the Pre-board exams (theory portion) have not been held, **the marks scored out of 65 marks in practical portion will be proportionately scaled up to 70 marks.**


### **For Class XII**

(i) The Pre-Board examinations of Class XII in Bengali, Kokborok, Mizo, Hindi, Sanskrit, History, Sociology & Philosophy have been conducted. It has been decided that the schools will send the Internal assessment marks of the subjects in which Pre-Board exam has been held, as per the earlier decision, (vide Memo No. F.23 (5)-SE-CEU/2019, dt. 22-12-2020 & No.F.23 (5)-SE-CEU/2019(L-I), dt 22-12-2020) which is – 5 marks from weekly test, 5 marks from assignment and 10 marks from Pre-Board exam.

(ii) The non-practical based subjects in which Pre-Board exam have not been conducted, (Political Science, Accountancy, Education, Business studies, Economics, English & Mathematics) the internal assessment marks will be computed as follows – 5 marks from weekly tests and 5 marks from assignment, and the total will be multiplied by 2.

(iii) The practical based subjects of H.S. in which the Pre-board exam (theory portion) have not been held, the marks scored out of 25 marks in practical portion will be proportionately scaled up to 30 marks.

**N.B.** Music Practical Exam of H.S. (+2 Stage) will be conducted in the online VC mode.
